

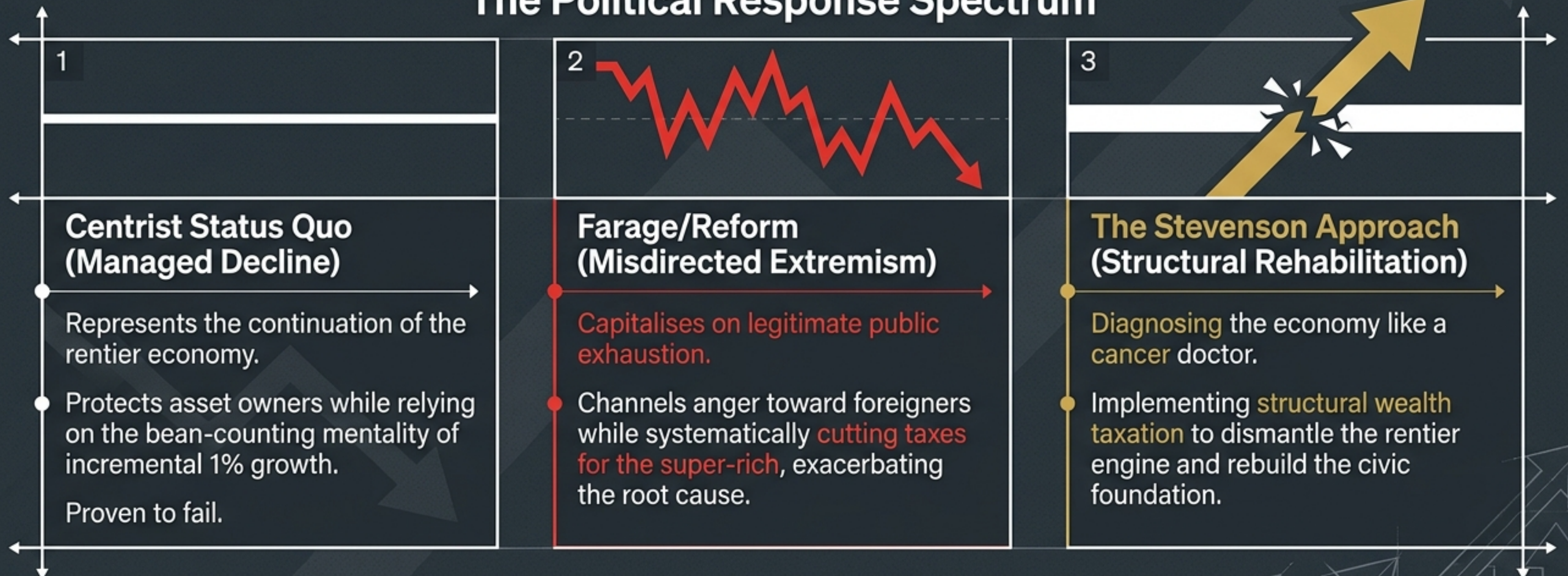

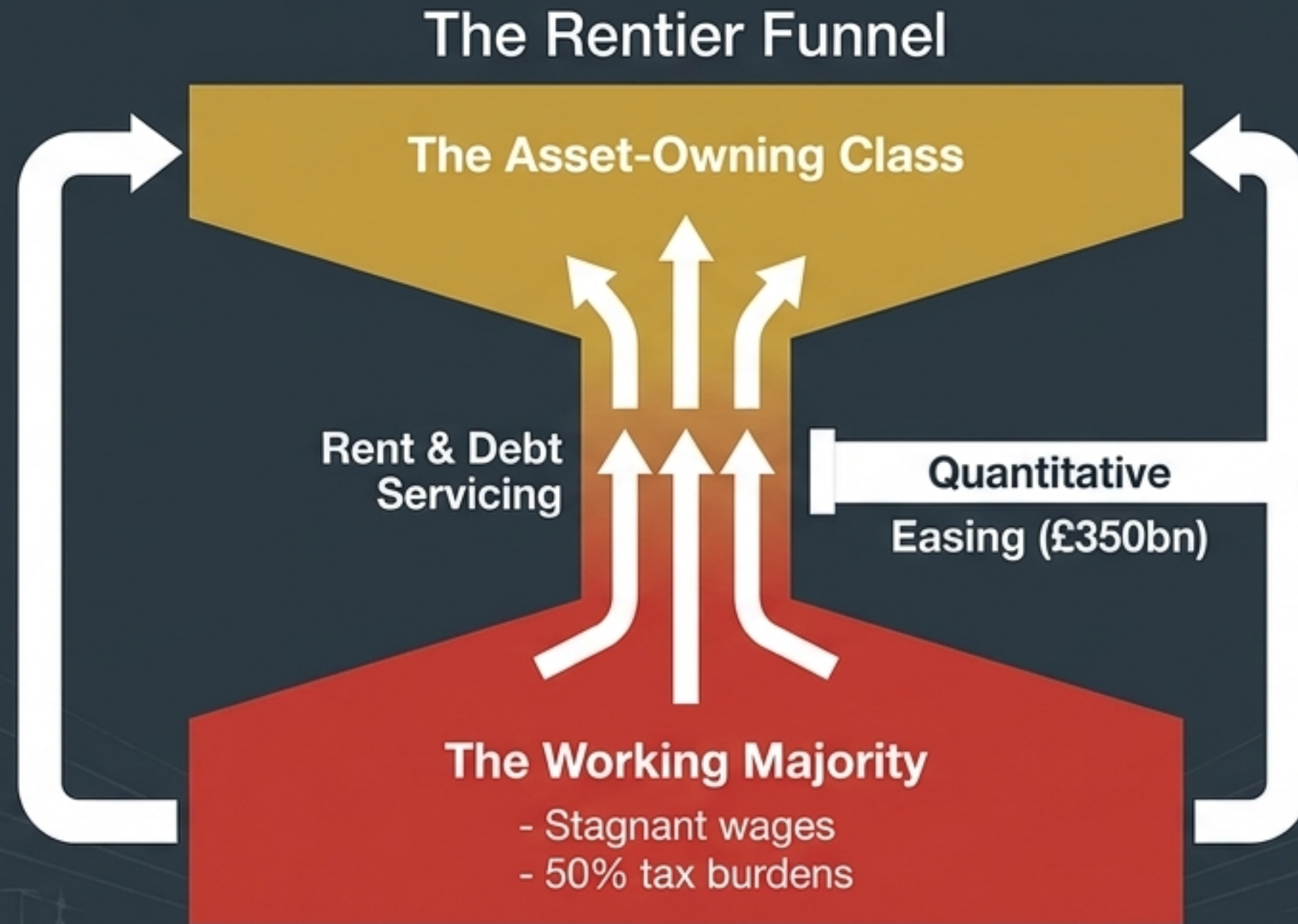

# The collapse of living standards leaves only three political trajectories.

## The Political Response Spectrum



Wealth is no longer **trickling down**;  
it is actively being **extracted upward**.



The system no longer rewards labour or productivity. Government capital injections inflate asset prices, while the working class must transfer their remaining labour value upward merely to secure housing and basic survival.

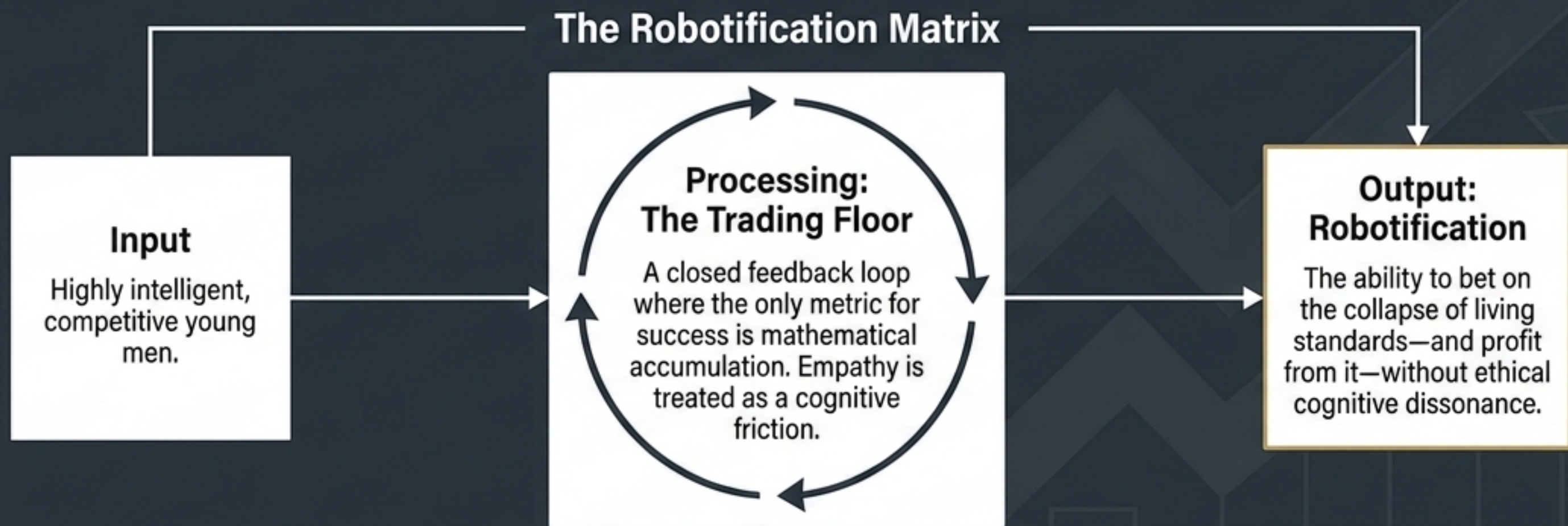
The average daily growth of aggregate UK billionaire wealth.

The top 10% now hold wealth exceeding £1.2 million per household, pushing the UK's wealth Gini coefficient to a severe 0.59.

The in-work child poverty rate in Glasgow. Overall, 4 million UK children (27%) live in poverty, with 44% of Glasgow residents trapped in the most deprived areas.

The extraction of capital starves local economies of necessary consumer spending.

# Systemic wealth extraction is driven by institutional amorality, not individual malice.

# Taxation is not about funding the government; it is about freeing hoarded resources.



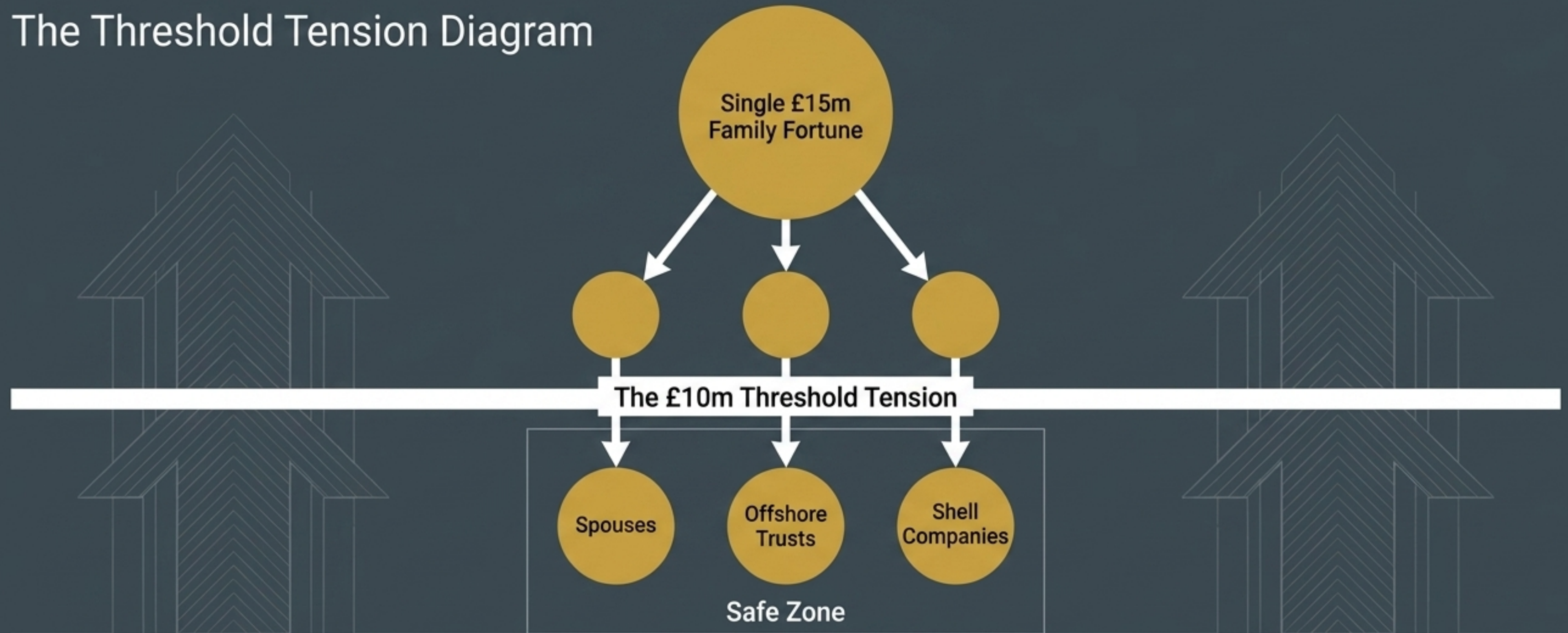
The Modern Monetary Theory (MMT) critique clarifies that a sovereign issuer of the Pound Sterling cannot go bankrupt like a household.

The government does not need the rich's money to function. It must tax them because the ultra-wealthy are monopolising the real resources (property, infrastructure, energy).

We tax to withdraw excess liquidity and redistribute physical capacity to the public.

# The administrative challenge of capturing fractured wealth.

## The Threshold Tension Diagram

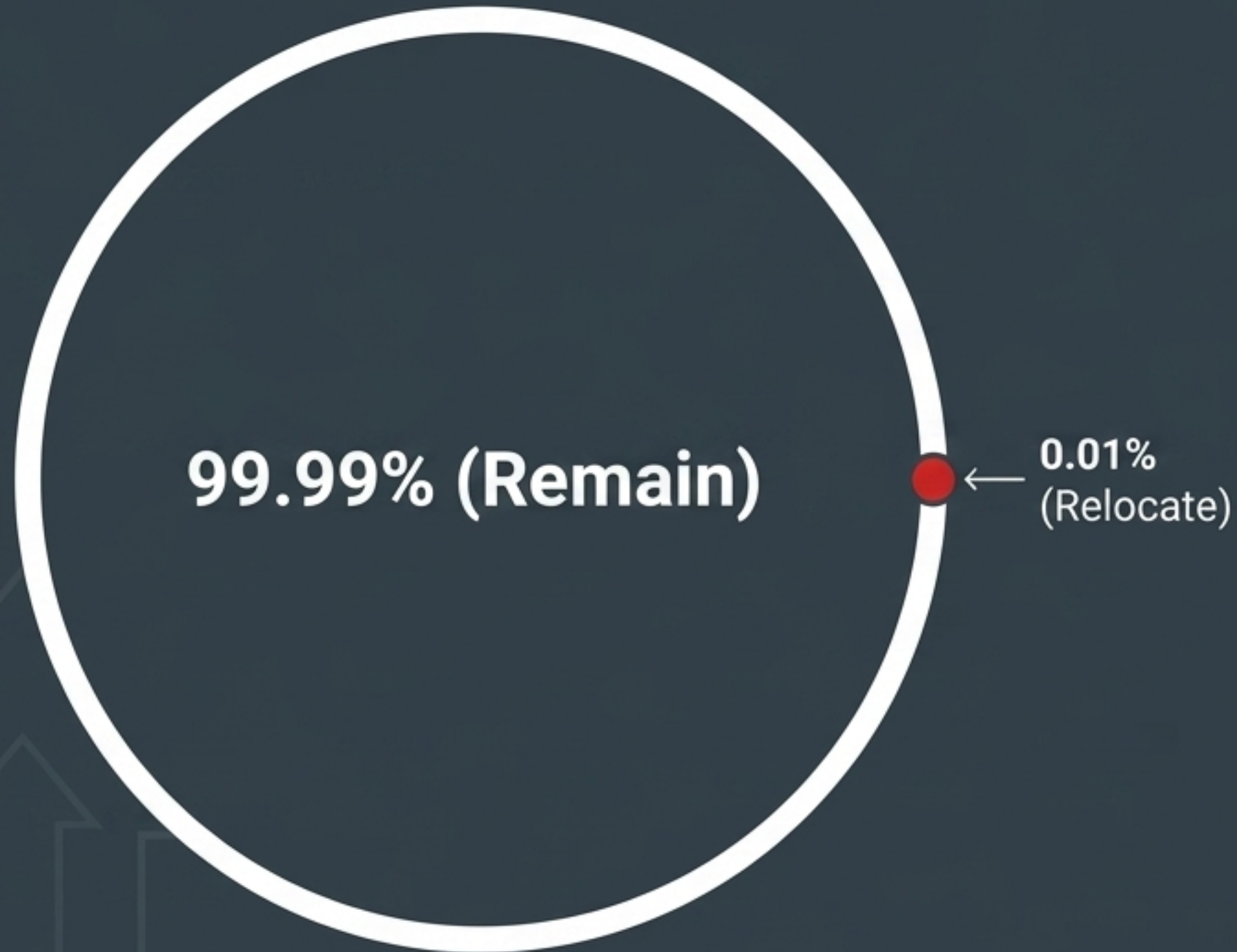


The Wealth Tax Commission found that broad annual taxes face a fatal flaw. High thresholds incentivise the ultra-rich to artificially fracture their assets across trusts and jurisdictions. Accurately valuing illiquid private assets every single year is a prohibitively expensive legal arms race for HMRC.

# Two mathematically viable blueprints for structural wealth taxation.

	<b>Wealth Tax Commission (One-Off Levy)</b>	<b>Tax Justice UK (Annual Levy)</b>
<b>Thresholds &amp; Targets</b>	>£500k per individual. Hits the upper-middle class.	>£10m. Hyper-targeted to the top 20,000 people (0.04%).

<b>Economic Distortion</b>	Zero. Retrospective assessment prevents behavioural shifts. ✓	Moderate. Requires rigorous HMRC enforcement and exit taxes. ✗
<b>Administrative Feasibility</b>	High. Valuation is a one-time event; deferral schemes protect illiquid assets.	Focused. HMRC only needs to audit 20,000 highly concentrated portfolios.

# The threat of a millionaire exodus is an engineered economic myth.



Opponents rely on the threat of capital flight—the premise that the ultra-rich will abandon the country. Empirical research by the Tax Justice Network on wealth tax reforms in Scandinavia proves this false. Place, culture, and established business networks matter. Only 0.01% of the richest households actually relocate.

## **The Statutory Deferral Scheme**

If a taxpayer lacks liquid cash to pay a wealth tax (e.g., their wealth is tied in a private business), the liability is deferred until the asset is sold. Nobody is forced to liquidate their family home or business.

**Systemic Extraction + Public  
= The Cynicism Tax**

The ultimate insight is not purely mathematical; it is psychological. The asset-owning class relies on the public believing that structural reform is impossible. Political figures weaponise this, claiming all institutions are useless. But the ultra-rich do not need institutions; the working majority does. Eradicating this manufactured cynicism is the absolute prerequisite to implementing structural wealth taxation.

# Institutional pressure is the only historically proven mechanism for retaining wealth.

## 1. Reframe the Narrative

Abandon the neoliberal myth of the bankrupt household. Advocate for the MMT reality: we are fighting for real resources, not just fiat currency.

## 2. Support Targeted Advocacy

Back the legal and economic lobbying of institutions like Tax Justice UK, the Poverty Alliance, and the Govan Law Centre.

## 3. Sectoral Organising

Capital organised flawlessly across borders to shield wealth; labour must organise to retain it.

Demand explicit commitments to Capital Gains equalisation.
